## SWIMMING LESSONS

### Registration Information

Registration for sessions 1 and 2 will be accepted on June 1st for Residents and June 8th for Non-Residents. Sign ups will be accepted at the Parks and Recreation Office, 2870 Clark Avenue. Residents may register for subsequent sessions two weeks prior to session start date; Non-residents may register for subsequent sessions one week prior to session start date.

**NO REFUNDS** will be given without a doctors note.

### Class Descriptions

**Mommy and Me (MM)** Parent assists child in the water while learning water skills and fun games.

**Water Exploration (WE)** Help students become comfortable in the water.

**Primary Skills (PS)** Students will learn the fundamentals of freestyle and backstroke.

**Stroke Readiness (S Read)** Build on the skills learned in PS and introduce elementary backstroke and the fundamentals of treading water.

**Stroke Development (SD)** Develop confidence in the strokes learned so far by improving endurance. Introduce breaststroke, sidestroke, and basics of turning at a wall.

**Stroke Refinement (S Ref)** Students coordinate and refine key strokes. Introduce butterfly, open turns, the feet first surface dive, and springboard diving.

**Private Lessons (PL)** The instructor will adapt his or her teaching to the skill level of the children in the class.

**Advanced Skills (AS)** Students will learn how to perfect their strokes, develop good fitness habits, springboard diving and learn advanced rescue skills.

## Welcome to Norco

### Silverlakes Project Approved by City Council

After more than a year of intense study and work, a comprehensive environmental impact report (EIR) and permits for this exciting new project have been approved. The City's partner in this project, Belstarr Sports Management (aka Blenheim Facility Management), is now poised to develop the 122-acre property along Hamner Avenue at Norco's northern city limits. The Silverlakes Equestrian & Sports Park will include:

- 45 acres of grass for equestrian shows and competitions, enough room for 21 full-size soccer fields
- 8 warm up, lunge and sand rings
- 7 synthetic turf fields for athletic events
- 135,000 sq. ft. multi-purpose building
- 8.3-acre campground
- 3-acre staging area providing access to the Santa Ana River Trails system
- Reception hall

Work on this "public-private partnership" project is proceeding and is expected to be completed in 2010. If you have questions, please contact the Parks and Recreation Department in City Hall.

## Parks Improvements Enhance Quality Of Life

Norco is blessed with a wide variety of parks, open space and outdoor opportunities that contribute to our high quality of life. Ongoing efforts to enhance our community's parks and open space systems include:

- Pikes Peak Park on Sixth Street was recently recognized as a recipient of the Outstanding Neighborhood Park Award by the California Park and Recreation Society (CPRS) for its design and features that serve all segments of our community, including those with physical disabilities. Pikes Peak Park has quickly become a favorite of young and old alike in our community.



- Significant improvements are being made to the George Ingalls Equestrian Event Center and the surrounding area of Sixth Street and Crestview Drive. The usable space of the Ingalls facilities is being greatly expanded through a public-private partnership with So Cal Sandbags, Inc. at no cost to the City. Progress is being made on the construction of a second arena and street access improvements through funds provided by the Norco Redevelopment Agency. Look for the second arena to be completed in early 2010.

- Improvements to the Wayne Makin-Shearer Sports Complex on Corydon Avenue are also being made possible by funds provided by the Norco Redevelopment Agency. Recently, the newly renovated snack stands have been renamed the "Hal Clark Community Youth Facilities." Plans are also underway to make field lighting improvements at this busy facility that serves so many of our young people.

- Community Center Park and the Riley Gym will be well served by an exciting parking lot expansion



and streetscape beautification project. This project along Hamner Avenue north of Sixth Street will also provide equestrian trail improvements including a new traffic signal and crossing at Alhambra Street. These improvements are made possible through Redevelopment and TUMF funds. The softball infields at this park have also undergone renovations and the Scout House facility will be improved.

- The Senior Center just south of the City Hall/School District complex will soon receive much needed façade improvements. The new "western" look of this busy facility will surely be enjoyed by Norco's growing senior citizen population.

- New restrooms are being constructed at Parmenter Park on Third Street near Reservoir Drive.

- A new park will be built with development impact fees on Cavaletti Drive just up the hill from the "Basin" riding area. This neighborhood arena will feature a riding arena, tot lot and trail connections to the Basin Arena.

## Enhanced Law Enforcement Results in Reduced Crime and Safer Streets

Norco is a much safer community than it was just a few years ago. Since 2005, crime has decreased by 30% and arrests have increased by 16%. These trends do not occur by chance, but are the direct result of careful planning and community resource allocation. Norco's enhanced public safety is the result of City Council's efforts to increase Sheriff Department staffing levels serving our community. Through a series of grants and budget allocations, Norco is now protected by six more full-time Deputies than it was just five years ago.

Norco's streets and equestrian trails are much safer today too. The City Council has doubled the number of Deputy Sheriffs assigned to traffic matters from three to six in the last four years. As a result, speeding and other hazardous violation citations have more than doubled, and traffic collisions have almost been cut in half. Increased traffic enforcement has certainly improved the safety of motorists, pedestrians and equestrians.



Keeping our community safe is the number one priority of the City Council as evidenced by the funding allocations in our City's budget. This focus on promoting safety will remain a paramount consideration as we work to preserve and enhance the quality of life in Horsetown USA.

### Bulky Waste Pick-up

All Norco residents are entitled to three individual curbside bulky waste pick-ups per year!

Please follow these guidelines and call Waste Management at (800) 423-9986 IN ADVANCE to schedule a pick-up:

- *All wood or tree limbs should be tied and cut into 4-foot lengths, 2 feet in diameter, and weigh no more than 50 pounds.*
- *Nothing should be placed loosely at the curb (i.e., old mattresses, furniture, etc.) until you have called to schedule your bulky waste pick-up!*
- *ALL bulky waste pick-ups (held on Mondays only) must be scheduled with Waste Management prior to the pick up date; therefore, schedule your pick-up with that in mind.*
- *No household hazardous waste, commercial waste, or automobile bodies/parts allowed!*

Following these guidelines will help ensure the safety of Waste Management employees, as well as maximize the opportunity to recycle your items!

## Attention Parents: Hosting Underage Drinking Parties is Unlawful

Youth access to alcoholic beverages is a nationwide problem. Often parents and other adults have a high tolerance for underage drinking parties, allowing them to occur on their property and without any supervision. Norco's City Council and Corona's City Council recently passed new laws to help reduce youth access to alcoholic beverages. These new laws, called "Social Host Ordinances" make parties or gatherings unlawful where alcohol is served to, consumed by or in the possession of underage persons. This law holds the person in charge of the property, where the party is occurring, responsible for preventing youth access to alcohol. Party hosts may be liable for fines up to \$1,000 or may be incarcerated for up to six months if they fail to prevent youth from possessing or consuming alcoholic beverages at their parties.



## "We Are Norco!" — Go Cougars!

Norco is proud of its outstanding Norco High School, which is constantly evidenced by uncommon community support. Improvements now underway and on the drawing boards at Norco High School include:

- New Stadium with artificial turf and a synthetic track
- Wrestling/Weight Room with concession stands and restrooms
- Aquatics Center
- Performing Arts Center
- Expanded Administration building and new Entry Lobby
- Bridge connection to the Agricultural Facilities



These tremendous improvements, made possible by the Corona-Norco Unified School District Measure U ballot measure and the Norco Redevelopment Agency, will greatly benefit our young people and add to the pride we feel for our community. An improved equestrian trail will also be constructed on Hillside Avenue east of the stadium.

The Norco Animal Shelter provides a vital community service by caring for mistreated, abandoned, or unclaimed dogs, cats, horses and other livestock. Animal Control is also responsible for ensuring rabies control by providing dog licensing and picking up all types of stray animals. Many animals are not claimed by their owners each year and are available for adoption after six business days' impoundment. Some are owner relinquishments and need homes too! Animal Control is also responsible for enforcing animal-related Ordinances in the City of Norco such as dog licensing. Dog licenses for an unaltered (unspayed or un-neutered) dog is \$30.00. Altered dogs are \$10.00. The rate for Senior Citizens (age 62 or better) is \$2.00 each for the first two dogs and \$6.00 each for the second two. Senior Citizens receive the reduced rate for dog license only if the dog is spayed or neutered.

The Norco Animal Shelter provides a vital community service by caring for mistreated, abandoned, or unclaimed dogs, cats, horses and other livestock. With the high cost of boarding mistreated or abandoned animals, the Norco Animal Shelter is in need of additional funding. The monthly donation will be included in your City of Norco utility bill until otherwise canceled by you in writing. ## At home: How to Listen to Your Kids

Why don't you and your kids communicate better? If you've asked this question more than once, you may want to take a look at your own listening skills. It's as true with children as it is with adults: Good communication is mostly listening.

- **Don't interrupt.** Kids, especially younger children, may need more time to find words they need. Be patient. You don't like being cut off in mid-sentence, and your children don't enjoy being interrupted either.
- **Ask good questions.** Grownups may see a yes-or-no question as an opportunity to expound at length on a subject. Children are more likely to take the query literally and respond with a one-word answer. Structure questions that encourage full answers—what did you do? Why did that happen?
- **Be empathetic.** You don't have to agree with what your child says to understand how he or she feels. Before giving advice, share your own feeling honestly and concisely: "I get angry when that happens to me, too. What do you think you could have done differently?"


